In 2017, we:

- * Distributed more than 79,000 meals.
- * Offered more than 274 children free education and daily food.
- * Made sure that all children at our school received a health check.
- * Saved 16 babies and children at the train station from dying of disease.
- * Helped more than 400 children on a daily basis in our school, at the train station and in the slum.
- * Offered more than 20 children and adolescents support and caregiving in our activity centre (Monday-Saturday).
- * Have 28 employees in Kolkata, and, over the past three years, we had 28 volunteers from Denmark supporting our projects in Kolkata.
- * Helped more than 14 pregnant adolescents with health checks and during labour.

* Helped more than 200 children to receive treatments at the hospital.


These vital resources were raised through charity dinners, funds, business- and private donations, as well as memberships.

PIA'S REPORT



"In the beginning of 2017, we sent off a team of volunteers for three and six months. Later that year, a new team of volunteers arrived for another six months, followed by two young assistants, only 19 years of age, as a support to the volunteers.

The volunteers took on responsibility of our various projects, with a very positive result. It turned out to be a beneficial approach to all of our projects, as we were now able to work much more efficiently and focused, which, amongst other things, allowed us to start up our second and third school, and secure a daily presence at the Sealdah Station.

All our volunteers pay for their own flight tickets as well as for food and pocket money throughout their stay. The only thing we have to offer is free accommodation in a house where we all live together. Establishing Gadens Børn's voluntary programme is the best thing I have accomplished in my life. The happiness and tremendous joy my heart is being filled with can only be described as pure love.

As the founder of Gadens Børn, along with all our volunteers, it is simply amazing that we have been able to establish and develop Gadens Børn into what it is today.

My goal for 2017 was to have the best schools, and particularly a solid safety net, for all children and adolescents at the Sealdah Station, and I think we finished pretty strong.

My future vision is to start an orphanage for 60 vulnerable children, and I would like to start a health clinic, which can provide free health care to such vulnerable children and adolescents. In addition, I have a wish to provide access to schooling for even more street children and children who are born into abject poverty. Such schooling should be at the same level and of the same quality as Indian private schools, attendance of which is a privilege reserved for wealthy families."

DREAMS THAT DID COME TRUE

SEALDAH SCHOOL AND ACTIVITY CENTRE CM & SS

On October 16th, 2017, our dream of opening Sealdah School and Activity Centre came true, and we are deeply grateful for the warm welcome we received from children, parents and the local community. Ever since the school was opened, the number of pupils has increased, and each and every day we welcome new children to the nursery, kindergarten, school and activity centre.

Sealdah School is our third primary school in Kolkata, and it is located only 1.4 km from the station. Since the pupils of Sealdah School come from the worst slum areas in Kolkata, we have introduced additional resources to make it a place the children will seek. Accordingly, the school provides broadened opportunities with extended opening hours in that it offers kindergarten, school, after-school care and an activity centre for the young homeless, as well as a registration office.

On an ordinary day, we pick up the children by bus from Sealdah Station and in the slums near the school. Everyone is eagerly ready, waiting to be registered, before they get on the bus that takes them to school, where breakfast is waiting. After the children have eaten their breakfast and their tummies are full, the teaching begins. Focus is on fun and creative teaching based on educational and nurturing relations. The timetable includes English, Mathematics, Hindi, General Knowledge and IT.

By 2pm, it is lunch time, and all children and grown-ups sit together and eat. After lunch, it is time for after-school activities. The activities vary from day to day, and we try making them as fun and attractive as possible. In the afternoon, we serve a snack to those who are hungry, and by 4:30pm it is time to tidy up, before the children get ready to be taken home. On Saturday's, the school is closed; however, the activity centre will be open. Usually, we start a day in the centre by visiting and playing in the park, followed by more calm and relaxing activities.

We are incredibly proud of our Sealdah School and Activity Centre CM & SS and of the work that our amazing Danish volunteers and local workers in India perform each and every day. Big thanks to everyone who has supported and made it possible for us to reach this milestone.

Our first big Charity Dinner in Norway was held on November 5th at the Michelin Restaurant Statholdergaarden in Oslo. A PERSONAL STORY FROM VOL-UNTEER TANJA HARALDSEN





I don't know what your life would have been like, and it may seem so unfair that you didn't even get a chance in life; but I choose to believe that there is a higher purpose with your departure, because now, you are in a better place.

The evening before you left us, you smiled at us, and I got to take a picture of it. This picture I will keep forever.

I think of you every single day, and I feel blessed that I got the opportunity to meet you this short time you spent here on earth. You are a part of me now. Please also know that your mother is doing well, and each time she sees me, she asks me about the picture on my mobile phone.

Proudly, she would show all her friends the pictures of you, how beautiful and lovely you are. Now, you are a star in the sky, watching us from above, smiling your most beautiful smile. We miss you, every day.

If you would be with us still, you would bee three and a half months old by now.

I still remember the first time I got to hold you. I felt this indescribable love for you. You were something very special, and from the moment you came to this world, you were loved by so many people, both here in Kolkata and back home in Denmark.

Unfortunately, this is just one of many sad stories our volunteers encounter. But without their help and support to both children and new mothers, babies, such as Piya, would have had an even worse start in life.

This is why we are so appreciative of everything our volunteers accomplish every single day in their struggle to help the children.

NEW PROJECTS IN THE MAKING

HEALTH CLINIC

We spend a lot of hours, energy and resources on helping sick babies and children at the hospital, which only reinforces our belief in the fact that there is an enormous need for a free health clinic for vulnerable children and adolescents.

Therefore, in 2018, we plan to open a health clinic, and we hope that this clinic and the provision of free health checks and vaccines will contribute to the prevention of diseases and injuries. The majority of children live in areas where there is a lot of garbage and with no toilets - this is taken care of behind the homes or in the river – the same river that downstream is being used to bathe and wash clothes in. In the slum areas, the children live in sheds or on the street. Their homes are invaded by rats and other pests, so hygiene is at its lowest in these areas, allowing bacteria to flourish. As street children are considered the lowest ranked citizens in society, they are often treated badly at hospitals, which is why they feel insecure and unsafe and try to avoid hospitals at any price. As a result, we rarely get the children treated until they are running a high fever and are close to being unconscious or dead.

Gadens Børn's health clinic will provide vaccinations and help prevent malaria, dengue and typhoid. Furthermore, it will treat wounds and diseases before they become infected. Young girls, who have been impregnated, voluntarily or by other means, will have the opportunity to receive pregnancy check-ups, ultrasound scans and supervisory dialogues.

We wish to offer free treatments, medicines, health care and vaccinations in a clean and safe environment. Currently, we are in the midst of preparations, and we look very much forward to being able to provide free and worthy treatments to vulnerable children and adolescents.

ORPHANAGE

Our biggest wish for 2018 is to start an orphanage for 60 homeless children. In all its simplicity, the aim of this orphanage is to offer children living in the streets a permanent home. Countless children live in unsafe environments with no guarantee for daily food or solicitude of any kind. As many of these children live all by themselves, they are easy victims of human trafficking, rape and violence.

These children have no accessible safety net and so they are left all to themselves. Our vision for the future orphanage is to be able to offer 60 children a permanent home, where they will be guaranteed an everyday life with nourishing meals, access to health care, psychological help and education, as well as activities and caring adults. In this orphanage, the children will have the opportunity to build trust in a better future.

Instead of using their energy on basic survival, there will be time for the children to be just kids. Jointly, we wish to create a healthy environment. Currently, we are exploring locations and applying for the right authorizations and registrations to be able to start the orphanage.

2017 has been a unique year with great progress both with regards to the projects and to financials. We are proud of what we have achieved and how much we keep developing each year. Yet again, we have reached our goals for the year, and we could not be more happy and excited about the coming year.

FINANCES

Our financial goal for the year was to raise DKK 1,000,000, all of which was targeted our projects in India, in full. It is with great pleasure that we can announce that we achieved our objective, even surpassing it. We are grateful for this achievement. Based on the fantastic help from our fundraisings, we can provide so many children access to education, health care, safety and care.

We reached our objective by conducting our annual charity dinner at 'Det Gamle Røgeri' for the fifth year running. In addition, we arranged a charity dinner at restaurant Statholdergaarden in Oslo, NO, and a Christmas Tree Party at 'Det Gamle Røgeri'. These first-timers' events were great successes, and so were the capital donations and the priceless help and support.

On top of that, we have so many amazing ambassadors supporting Gadens Børn. The artist, Betina Miemietz with her works of art; Helen Rasmussen, who is selling T-shirts via her shop 'Butik Klud'; Kate Wermuth, who designs and crafts leather key hangers and tassels; Julie Pallesen, who has designed a charity T-shirt in collaboration with Just Female; and Rohan Jarlhelt, a physical therapist, who donates DKK 50 for each carried out treatment.

Huge thanks to all of you, who support Gadens Børn on a daily basis. We could not have done it without either one of you!

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

2017 has been a year with countless wishes and planned projects; however, with India being a country where the situation may change from day to day, achieving our goals has not been a picnic.

This year, we opened our Sealdah School and Activity Center CM & SS

With so many children living at the station and in the slum areas, we have been waiting for so long to finally open a school near Sealdah Station. With a distance of only 1.4 km between the station and the school, it is much easier to move the children; and since the children won't have to take on a long walk to and from school, it does not disrupt their daily routines too much. The school has long opening hours, and it has an integrated kindergarten, an activity centre, and a day care centre for young homeless children.

All of these school programmes provide a great opportunity and support to the children, as they can get food, education, play, sleep and get away from the station and their daily lives.

BERETNING

We are proud to be able to provide such a safe base, and we will make sure to give the children all the love, care and peace they need.

The big dream – the orphanage

Our big wish is to open a permanent home for 60 homeless children. This is a project we have had in the making for a while; however, due to authorizations and registrations, it is a lengthy process. Despite of the extra effort to set it on its feet, we will reach our goal - and make this dream come true.

High Expectations for 2018

We have big plans and high expectations for 2018 - new initiatives and new opportunities that need to be realized. A great wish is to extend our school in Santoshpur, so we can enrol another 50 pupils. Also, a health clinic, to improve the children's conditions, is on the wishing list. It will provide free health checks and vaccinations, securing them a safe childhood.

The orphanage has been a dream we have pursued for a long time, and it is a strong wish to open it in 2018. We are excited about all our future projects and their kick-offs, and of course the development of Gadens Børn as such.
