IN 2018, WE:

• Started a health clinic, with doctors and/or nurses, offering free treatments to local citizens.

• Ran three schools, one kindergarten and a day care centre.

• Distributed more than 105,500 meals to children via our projects

• Offered approx. 430 children daily eligible and free schooling, including food, at our three schools.

• Made sure that all children at our schools have undergone free dental check ups and examinations by a nurse.

• Daily, helped more than 500 children through our schools, our health clinic, and through our out-reaching services.

• Managed 41 Indian employees and sent 4-6 Danish volunteers to our projects in Kolkata for 3-6 months at a time.

• Helped pregnant women with health examinations, as well as with support during and after labour.

• Helped children, adolescents and pregnat women with more than 100 hospital- and dental treatments

TRANSPARENCY, TRUST AND COMMITMENT

On November 28th, Gadens Børn celebrated its 6 years' anniversary.

It was a great day, which was celebrated in all of our schools. A day, on which we paid tribute to the overarching values of Gadens Børn: TRANSPAREN-CY, TRUST and COMMITMENT. The core of Gadens Børn is based on the fiery souls of our volunteers. They drive forward the organisation by implementing our values into their work. We have an outstanding utilisation rate and are proud to announce that 81% of all funds raised in 2017 went directly to our projects in India. This is only possible, because our projects are run by committed, trustworthy and competent volunteers. Thank you to all of you, who will continue to be the pivotal element in driving Gadens Børn.

THE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



I am so proud of this organisation, which, only six years ago, was no more than just a bunch of thoughts I had in a plane going home from my trip. An organisation, which today helps more than 500 children. Children, who otherwise would live on the streets without food, health, noticeable solicitude or a future. Children, who otherwise would have been easy victims of rape, abuse and human trafficking.

I live and breathe for those moments, in which I step into the schools and get to see the children I once met on the streets – shattered, tired and with an emptiness in their eyes – now running towards me - one big happy smile.

Our volunteers are the driving force of the organisation. They sincerely believe that all children have a right to a future. They start at Gadens Børn with a burning desire to help, and they experience, at first hand, how tough and merciless life can be. It makes me proud to see them grow as they take on the responsibility of attempting to make a difference to our children. I just love working with them.

My goal for 2018 was to start a health clinic. And we succeeded. So now, we can offer free, competent and worthy treatment to the local people in the slums of Kolkata.

My goal for 2019 will be to start an orphanage for the most vulnerable children – those children with no parents, or where violence and abuse are part of their everyday lives. We expect the orphanage to open its doors in September 2019.

My vision for the future is to continue providing access to schooling of the same quality and standard as Indian private schools to even more street children and children of extremely poor families. Schooling and education will ensure these children a brighter future and an everyday with access

OUR OWN HEALTH CLINIC

Gadens Børn is proud to announce that, today, we can offer free treatment to children and adults in the slums of Kolkata - treatments that oftentimes may be of vital necessity, and which could make the difference between life and death itself. Every year, we use a lot of resources to help sick children, adults and babies at the hospital. Treatment at the public hospital is of very variable quality, and especially children are often being treated badly. Our desire was to offer proper, free and dignified treatment.to each and everyone in need. In October, this dream became a reality, and subsequent to sheer hard preparatory work, we could declare the health clinic open.

Following the start-up, we learned how severe the lack of trust in doctors and hospitals is. Many locals have exclusively had bad experiences with the established health care system, thus, they won't come see our clinic unsolicited. This, despite the fact that we, through our daily outreaching services, meet numerous children and adults, who are in need of help. They cut their feet, stepped in pieces of broken glass or nails, suffered hefty burns, malaria, dengue, severe diarrhea, and so much more. Children, who will die if not being treated. We knew, it would require great outreaching and trustbuilding work, but we are still surprised, how much it actually takes.

So, instead of the locals having to go see us, we realized that we would have to seek out to them, in their safe and entirely known environment. Accordingly, we have restructured our clinic, so going forward, it will be a mobile unit with a minivan and an ambulance that will render treatments in the slum and at the station, which is where the patients reside. We have hired a married doctor's couple, who join us on Tuesdays and Fridays. In addition, our mobile clinic is staffed with voluntary nurses from Denmark.

Primary focus of our clinic is on:

- Regular health checks and supervisory dialogues with girls, who have been impregnated, voluntarily or by other means.
- Regular health checks and follow-ups of children and babies.

• Prevention and treatment of infections, such as measles, dengue, malaria, and diarrhea.

• Treatment of injuries and wounds, and other infections, such as abscesses, cuts, burns, etc.

PERSONAL REPORT FROM VOLUNTEER Amanda Sofie Vagn Christiansen

I'm sitting in my lovely apartment, eating breakfast of a slightly expensive bowl. From where I sit, I can oversee Copenhagen, beautiful Copenhagen. On the pavement in front of me, I can see a little family. A happy couple pushing their brand new baby carriage. It has it all, lots of fancy functionalities, and it is packed with baby equipment of top quality. In the carriage, amongst pillows and blankets, lies a little, well-nurtered baby. Completely ignorant of how blessed he is. He has his mother and father, who love eachother, and especially him. They have chosen eachother, and they have chosen him. He is a planned child. For the parents a real blessing.

At this sight, I cannot help but think about my friend in India. She is 17 years old. She lives on the platform at Sealdah station, and she will soon be a mother of two. Every day, she struggles with guilty conscience of not being able to take properly care of her almost one year old daughter. Her greatest wish is to be able to afford a tiny slum house, in which she can live with her husband and soon two children. Each Sunday, she visits her daughter at the shelter that takes care of her. She is allowed to stay for one hour in a visitors room. Whenever her husband is in a good mood, he may be persuaded to come along. Each week, she saves enough money to be able to by a little piece of new clothing for her daughter. It does soothe conscience a bit. During spring time, she became pregnat again. Not for a second she doubted whether or not to have this child. "I cannot have another child until I can take care of the child I have already." A huge realization. She sought for help to have an abortion at the public hospital, but she was met with harsh rejection and judgeful eyes. Abortion is illegal in India. She thought of poisining herself with over-thecounter medicines to get rid of the foetus,

but decided to not take that risk and keep the baby instead. I know she already loves this little life in her womb; but for her, this is not a planned baby. It is not a choice she made. No one ever taught her about prevention. No one ever taught her about pregnancy. The baby is just another challenge in her tough everyday life.

By now, she is almost half-way. I do hope that, despite her conditions, she is getting excited. I hope her husband will support her. I hope that he has stopped steeling from sleeping passangers during the nights, and instead protects his while she is asleep. It is not always easy to be a woman all alone at the station at night. I hope, he will be a loving father to his next child, and that he will stop abusing his wife and children. I hope they can condemn intoxicants like alcohol, glue and drugs, especially while she is pregnant and breastfeeding. But most of all, I hope that they will allow Gadens Børn to stay close by, so we can help them as much as possible.

It has been approximately one month since I left India as a volunteer. I miss being there for them. I miss giving them hugs, kisses on their foreheads, letting them know that everything will be just fine, although I sometimes wasn't too sure about that myself. I miss running towards them for a big group hug. The joy and love which I received during the 6 months I was there, no one will ever be able to take away again. Never have I felt so wanted and valued. A hole that is hard to fill. The feeling of abandonment, sorrow and deep misery still occupies me a lot. It is hard to be greatful of all we have, when the world is so unjust.


PROJECT 2019 GADENS BØRN'S ORPHANAGE

ORPHANAGE

In 2019, when we open the doors to our own orphanage, a great dream will become a reality. We have had this dream ever since the organisation was established, but there were many obstacles in our way. However, a new collaboration with a local NGO, Trinita, and our collected funds from the charity dinner accelerated the process and has made it easier to navigate through the maze of Indian bureaucracy. So now, the dream is just around the corner. The orphanage, in all its simplicity, will become a permanent home for the most disadvantaged of our children. Children, who live all by themselves at the station or in the slum with no parents, and children, where we can see that violence and abuse are part of their everyday lives.

According to Indian law, boys and girls are not allowed to live together, so we will start two orphanages – one for boys and one for girls. With these two orphanages, we expect to be able to offer 60 vulnerable children a permanent home. Currently, we are trying to find and purchase a property close to the Sealdah Station and our own school, Sealdah School, to ensure the foundations in the project. We wish to offer the children caring, warm and stable relations, as well as a structured daily life. With the children having a safe and stable base, the aim is to have them benefit from our school programme and consequently learn, grow and get educated towards a brighter future. The children will live in the orphanage, but they will attend kindergarten or school at one of our three schools or a public school. The afternoons will provide opportunities for doing homework and creative activities such as yoga, self-defence and dancing lessons.

As with our other projects, we will try to hire local personnel to the extent possible, whilst project management is assigned to our volunteers.

REPORT

2018 has been yet another exceptional year with great project and financial progress. We are proud of how we are growing. We do make many mistakes, and we do encounter push-backs, but it does not stop us. We reflect on it, we learn, and then we continue with our work. The goals we set for 2018, we achieved.

FINANCES

Our financial target for 2018 was to safeguard a solid financial foundation for the continuous operation of our three schools and of our mobile health clinic. Moreover, we wanted to generate capital to establish our orphanage. This objective has been attained. We generated an equity that allowed us to invest in a big property for our orphanage. The capital was raised through funds, private donations, members, collections and our charity gala. We are deeply grateful for all those people who support our work. It gives us the courage to keep going.

We are also supported by the Jubilee's Foundation, The Bird Foundation, The Foundation of 17-12-1981, Gudbjørg and Ejnar Honores Foundation, The Remuneration Foundation in the Novo Group, SAS Group of Developing Countries, Erik Thunes Grant, Ministry of Culture / Gaming Funds, as well as Rotary Høje Taastrup.

In addition, in 2018, we launched our new sponsor scheme, which allows our members to support and follow a school class. The sponsor scheme is called KNUS ('hugs'), which stands for K-ærlighed (love), N-æring (food), U-ddannelse (education) and S-undhed (health). Recruiting members has been harder than initially expected, but those who joined, provide us with a stable financial basis. One of the 2019 goals is to recruit even more permanent KNUS-members.

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

Our three schools are running well. Kidderpore School (125 pupils) and Santosphur School (250 pupils) are almost self-driven. We have strong superintendents and competent personnel, who have established professional, suitably qualified routines and processes. We have had bigger challenges at the Sealdah School (50 pupils), as the children come from very exposed areas and they are extremely vulnerable. It has been difficult to establish a structured everyday life. Consequently, in the end of 2018, we decided to employ a new superintendent, who has many years of experience with vulnerable children and their families. She has been well-received by the other employees, and we believe that she will have a positive influence on the school.

A major focus area regarding our schools is the frequency of attendance. The children come from vulnerable families, who need their labour. i.e., they are often forced to beg or watch their younger siblings instead of going to school. It can be difficult to persuade their parents about the long-term perspective of their children getting an education. Therefore, we spend a lot of time building good relations with the children's carers. Our volunteers go visit the families and they listen and talk to them. We conduct amd facilitate many meetings for the parents, where they can air concerns and wishes. Furthermore, we have introduced routines, intended to inform the parents of their children's progress. This has been a great success.

In total, we have approx. 430 children registered in our schools. 62% of them attend on a regular basis. Our goal for 2019 is to increase this figure.

EXPECTATIONS FOR 2019

We have big plans as well as high expectations for 2019.

• We wish to expand Sealdah school, increasing the number of pupils to approx. 80.

• Our mobile health clinic will become an integral and well-attended part of the community.

• The orphanage will become a reality, with 60 children calling it their home.
